When It Matters Most – In 18 career games when the Capitals have faced elimination, Alex Ovechkin has registered 19 points (9g, 10a) and Nicklas Backstrom has recorded 13 points (3g, 10a). Justin Williams has posted a 13-6 record and has registered 26 points (14g, 12a) in 19 career playoff games when his team has faced elimination. According to the Elias Sports Bureau, Williams' average of 0.74 goals per game in elimination games is the third-best in NHL history among players who have faced elimination at least ten times, trailing Hall of Famers Maurice "Rocket" Richard (15 goals in 17 games, 0.88 per game) and Pavel Bure (12 goals in 15 games, 0.80 per game). In addition, Williams has earned 37 points (16g, 21a) in Games 5-7 in his career (45 GP) and his teams have posted a 27-18 record in those games. Since the 2010-11 postseason, he ranks tied for third in the NHL in goals (12) and fourth in points (25) in Games 5-7 of a series.

TOP FIVE CAPS FACTS

Comeback Caps – Washington has overcome a 3-1 series deficit twice in franchise history, most recently in the 2009 Eastern Conference quarterfinals. The Capitals defeated the Rangers in seven games after trailing the series 3-1 and outscored New York 11-4 in the final three games of the series. Alex Ovechkin scored two goals and Nicklas Backstrom added three assists in Games 5-7 against the Rangers. Washington also overcame a 3-1 series deficit in the 1988 Patrick Division semifinals to defeat Philadelphia in seven games.

Osh with the Most – T.J. Oshie recorded an assist in Game 4 at Pittsburgh (5/3), marking his 10th point in 10 games this postseason (3g, 7a). Oshie ranks tied for fourth in the NHL in assists this postseason and tied for sixth in points. He has earned a point in eight of his 10 games this postseason and in 10 of his last 12 playoff games dating back to last postseason (5/7/16-5/3/17: 5g, 8a). The Everett, Wash., native has recorded nine points (5g, 4a) in 10 career playoff games against Pittsburgh and tallied 20 points (9g, 11a) in 22 career playoff games with Washington. In addition, Oshie's 10 points this postseason matches his playoff career high (2015-16: 10).

Saint Nick – Nicklas Backstrom registered two points (1g, 1a) in Game 3 at Pittsburgh (5/1), marking his second consecutive multi-point game (4/29 vs. PIT: 1g, 1a) and team-leading fourth multi-point game of the postseason. In addition, Monday marked his 17th career postseason multi-point game. Backstrom has tallied 10 points (4g, 6a) in 10 games this postseason and ranks tied for fifth in the NHL in goals, tied for sixth in points and tied for seventh in assists. The Gavle, Sweden, native has recorded 22 points in his last 23

playoff games (5/13/15-5/3/17: 6g, 16a) and has earned 16 points (5g, 11a) in 17 career playoff games against Pittsburgh.

The Great Eight - Alex Ovechkin earned an assist in Game 3 at Pittsburgh (5/1), tying Scott Stevens (44) for third place on the Capitals postseason assists list. The Moscow native has earned 89 points (45g, 44a) in 94 career playoff games and ranks fourth among active players (min. 40 GP) in career playoff goals per game (0.48) and eighth in career playoff points per game (0.95). Ovechkin has tallied seven points (4g, 3a) in 10 games this postseason and ranks tied for fifth in the NHL in goals (4). He ranks first in franchise playoff history in goals, points, power-play goals (15) and power-play points (39), ranks tied for first in game-winning goals (6), tied for third in assists and fifth in games played.

Holt-beast – Braden Holtby has posted four shutouts, a 2.00 goals-against average and a .933 save percentage in 56 career playoff games. Holtby ranks first in franchise history in career playoff wins (27) and games played (56). The Lloydminster, Saskatchewan, native ranks tied for first in NHL playoff history (min. 40 games played) in career save percentage and eighth in career goals-against average. In addition, Holtby ranks first among active NHL goaltenders (min. 20 games played) in career playoff save percentage and goals-against average. Holtby has allowed two goals or fewer in 35 of his 56 career playoff games and Washington has posted a 24-11 record in those games. Since he made his postseason debut in 2011-12, Holtby ranks fourth in the NHL in playoff games with two or fewer goals against.

ADDITIONAL CAPITALS NOTES

Five Alive – The Capitals have won three consecutive Game 5s when they trailed the series 3-1 (2008 ECQF, 2009 ECQF, 2016 ECSF). Braden Holtby has posted a 1.56 goals-against average and a .944 save percentage in eight career Game 5s and Alex Ovechkin has tallied 10 points (6g, 4a) in 13 career Game 5s.

Justin Time – Justin Williams tallied an assist in Game 4 at Pittsburgh (5/3), marking his ninth point in 10 games this postseason (3g, 6a). Williams ranks tied for seventh in the NHL in assists this postseason and tied for ninth in points. He has earned a point in seven of his 10 games this postseason and in 11 of his last 14 playoff games (5/2/16-5/3/17: 6g, 8a). In addition, Williams has earned 16 points (6g, 10a) in 22 career playoff games with Washington.

Chipping In – Evgeny Kuznetsov scored a goal in Game 4 at Pittsburgh and Marcus Johansson added an assist. Kuznetsov (4g, 3a) and Johansson (2g, 5a) have each earned seven points in 10 games this postseason and have tallied a point in six of Washington's 10 playoff games. Kuznetsov (2014-15: 7) and Johansson (2015-16: 7) have also both matched their postseason career high in points.

Rising to the Occasion – Alex Ovechkin has recorded 25 points (11g, 14a) in 17 career playoff games against Pittsburgh and has earned a point in 14 of those 17 games. In addition, he has tallied four points (1g, 3a) in four games this series and ranks first among active NHL players in career playoff points against the Penguins. Ovechkin recorded 14 points (8g, 6a) in seven games against Pittsburgh in the 2009 Eastern Conference semifinals, marking the most points in a playoff series in franchise history and tied for the fifth-most points in a series in the NHL since the 1987-88 season. Ovechkin also led the Capitals with seven points (2g, 5a) in six games against the Penguins last postseason.

Movin' On Up – Nicklas Backstrom earned an assist on Kevin Shattenkirk's game-winning goal in overtime in Game 3 at Pittsburgh (5/1), passing Dale Hunter (47) for first place on the Capitals postseason assists list. In addition, with his two points (1g, 1a) on Monday, Backstrom tied Hunter (72) for second place on the franchise postseason points list and passed Scott Stevens (26) for second place on the Capitals postseason power-play points list. Backstrom has earned 72 points (24g, 48a) in 93 career playoff games and ranks first in franchise postseason history in assists, tied for second in points, second in power-play points (28), third in power-play assists (21), fourth in goals, sixth in games played and tied for sixth in game-winning goals (4).

Check, Please – The Capitals have recorded 380 hits this postseason, ranking second in the NHL. Alex Ovechkin ranks second in the NHL in hits this postseason (48) and Matt Niskanen and Tom Wilson rank tied for sixth (37). In addition, Brooks Orpik ranks first among active NHL players in career postseason hits (494) and Ovechkin (408) ranks fifth.

Power Surge – The Capitals scored two power-play goals in Game 3 at Pittsburgh (5/1), marking the second time this postseason (4/15 vs. TOR: 2 PPG) and 35th time in franchise postseason history Washington has scored two or more power-play goals in a game. The Capitals have scored a power-play goal in six of their 10 games this postseason and are 8 for 31 on the power-play (25.8%), ranking second in the NHL.

O From D – Capitals defensemen have earned a point in all 10 of Washington's games this postseason and have combined to record 17 points (4g, 13a). In addition, six of the seven defensemen to play in the series have earned a point. Kevin Shattenkirk scored the game-winning goal in overtime in Game 3 at Pittsburgh (5/1), joining Rod Langway (4/25/90 vs. NY Rangers) and Mike Green (5/4/13

vs. NY Rangers) as the only defensemen in Capitals history to score an overtime goal in the postseason. Shattenkirk's goal marked his first career postseason overtime goal, game-winning goal and power-play goal. In addition, the goal marked his first Capitals playoff goal. The 6'0", 209-pound defenseman leads Washington blueliners with five points (1g, 4a) in 10 games this postseason.

Striking First – The Capitals have scored nine goals in the first period this postseason, ranking tied for first in the NHL. In addition, Washington has posted a 24-6 record since the 2009-10 postseason when scoring first.

Working Overtime – Washington is 4-2 in overtime this postseason, marking the third time in franchise playoff history the Capitals have played six or more overtime games (1997-98: 7, 2011-12: 6) and the second time Washington has won four or more playoff games in overtime (1997-98: 5-2).

TEAM NOTES:

PENS MVP

Marc-Andre Fleury turned in another exemplary performance in Game 4, brushing aside 36 of the 38 shots sent his way, the eighth time in nine starts this postseason that he has made 30 or more saves. For perspective on Fleury's workload, and how well he's thrived with it, consider that his eight instances of making 30 or more saves is double the next-closest netminders, all of whom had done it only four times each (prior to Friday's games). The goalies who have made 30 or more saves at least four times this postseason include **Braden Holtby**, **Cam Talbot**, **Henrik Lundqvist**, **Jake Allen** and **Pekka Rinne**.

Since the beginning of the Second Round on April 26, Fleury's .937 save percentage is the best in the league, ahead of Nashville's Rinne (.925). Only Rinne (2.02) has a better goals-against average this round than Fleury's 2.24 (all numbers are heading into Friday's games).

In Game 4, Fleury picked up his 60th career NHL playoff win, becoming just the 16th goalie in league history to accomplish that feat.

MAKING HISTORY

Rookie star **Jake Guentzel** kept right on racking up the points in Game 4, scoring the Penguins' second goal and assisting on the **Justin Schultz** game-winning tally for his fourth multi-point effort of the playoffs. Those points improved his playoff point total to 12, putting him one shy of tying **Jaromir Jagr**'s franchise rookie playoff record of 13 points back in 1991.

According to the NHL Morning Skate and the Elias Sports Bureau, Guentzel became the fourth player in the NHL's modern era (since 1943-44) to score at least eight goals in his first nine career playoff games – and just the third to do so in a single postseason. The others: **Maurice Richard** (12 in 1944), **Mario Lemieux** (11 in 1989) and **Wayne Gretzky** (9 from 1980-81).

The last rookie to score at least eight goals in a single playoff year was Boston's **Brad Marchand**, who collected 11 goals in 2011 to equal the fourth-highest total by a rookie in one playoff year in NHL history.

SECOND ROUND TEAM LEADERS

Jake Guentzel has consistently filled up the stats sheet for the Penguins in the Second Round, which is a huge reason why the Pens have a 3-1 lead. He leads the club in goals (3), points (6) and plus/minus (+5) during the first four games of the series. Here are the Pens' leaders in several other categories:

THEY JUST PLAY, HE JUST WINS

The steady influence of head coach **Mike Sullivan** can't be stated enough. With his team's victory in Game 4, Sullivan picked up his 23rd playoff win as head coach of the Pens, tying Hall of Famer **Scott Bowman** for the second-most such wins in franchise history. **Dan Bylsma** is first with 43 wins.

Not only would the Penguins' next win put Sullivan in sole possession of second place on that list, but it would make him the first coach in club history to win each of his first six playoff series behind the bench. Both Bylsma and Bowman won their first five series as Pittsburgh's head coach.

OFFENSIVE REVIVAL

Justin Schultz has stepped up his offensive game for the Penguins in this series, collecting points in each of the past three contests (2G-2A-4PTS), including the first game-winning goal of his NHL playoff career in Game 4.

Entering Friday night, Schultz placed third among all NHL defenders in playoff points with seven.

Since Nov. 30, Schultz has 53 points (14G-39A) in his past 65 games (regular season and playoffs).

SIMPLY SID

No stats written here can accurately portray how well Hart Trophy finalist **Sidney Crosby**, who missed Game 4, played through the first two games of this series. In Game 2, Crosby added two more assists to run his playoff career point total to 148, surpassing **Jaromir Jagr** for second-most in franchise history. It was Crosby's 52nd career multi-point playoff effort, which set a new team record. According to TSN, it was Crosby's 24th career multiple-assist playoff game, which surpassed **Mario Lemieux**'s team playoff record in that category as well.

Crosby's next assist will equal Lemieux's franchise playoff record of 96.

Crosby is two points shy of becoming the 28th player in NHL history to record 150 playoff points.
