TEAM NOTES:

27.5 - The average age on the Islanders opening-night roster is 27.5. **Noah Dobson** (19) is the youngest player on the roster and **Johnny Boychuk** (35) is the oldest. If **Dobson** makes his NHL debut, he will be the first player born in this millennium to play for the Islanders (DOB 1/7/00).

2018-19 Final Standings: The Islanders finished the 2018-19 regular season with 103 points, their highest total since the 1983-84 season (104 points). It was the 10th time in franchise history that the Islanders reached 100 points.

Shutout Record: The Islanders set a franchise record with 11 shutouts in 2018-19. The team recorded at least one shutout in every month.

Even Split: Last season, The Islanders won 24 games at home and 24 games on the road. It was the first time that the team won 24 games both at home and on the road in the same season

Trotz Milestones: Last year, head coach Barry Trotz passed former Islanders' Hall-of-Fame coach Al Arbour for fourth place on the NHL's all-time wins list. Trotz' 810 regular season wins are second most among active coaches

Quick facts about every player on the Islanders' 23-man roster

FORWARDS

JOSH BAILEY: Last season, Josh Bailey set career-highs in game-winning goals (3) and plus/minus rating (+8) during his 11th season with the Islanders. Bailey, 29, is the longest tenured active Islander and enters the 2019-20 season ranked sixth all-time on the team's games played list (797).

MATHEW BARZAL: Entering his third NHL season, Mathew Barzal has led the Islanders in points and assists in both of his first two years with the team. Barzal, 22, ranks sixth among all 2015 draftees in assists, despite playing 73 fewer games than the next closest person ahead of him.

ANTHONY BEAUVILLIER: Last season, Anthony Beauvillier recorded his first-career hat trick and a career-high four-point night (3G, 1A) on Nov. 15 vs NYR. The Sorel-Tracy, QC native, is one of only 13 players from the 2015 draft class to surpass 200 NHL games.

DERICK BRASSARD: Entering his 13th NHL season, Derick Brassard, 32, will look to make his NY Islanders debut tonight, marking his seventh different NHL franchise. The Hull, QC native is 14 games shy of 800 NHL games.

CASEY CIZIKAS: Last season, Casey Cizikas became the eighth player in franchise history to score 20 goals in a season without scoring a single power-play goal. The Toronto, ON native set career-highs in goals (20) and points (33) in 73 games during seventh season in the NHL.

CAL CLUTTERBUCK: Entering his 12th season in the NHL, forward Cal Clutterbuck ranks fourth among active players in career hits (3,015) and second in hits/game (3.8). The Welland, ON native is 13 games shy of 800 NHL games.

MICHAEL DAL COLLE: Drafted by the Islanders in the First Round of the 2014 NHL Draft (5th overall), Michael Dal Colle is one of three Islanders draftees to make the 23-man roster out of training camp for the first time this season (Dobson & Toews). The Woodbridge, ON native represented Bridgeport in the AHL All-Star game last season.

JORDAN EBERLE: On June 14th, forward Jordan Eberle signed a five-year deal to remain with the Islanders through the 2023-24 season. The Regina, SK native led the team in post-season scoring with nine points (4G, 5A) in eight playoff games including the game-winning goal in Game 2 vs PIT.

ROSS JOHNSTON: Ross Johnston, a Charlottetown, PEI native is the lone undrafted player on the Islanders active 23-man roster.

LEO KOMAROV: Narva, Estonia native Leo Komarov led all Islanders forwards in several short-handed categories including total SH TOI (142:21), SH shots (8) and SH hits (15) last season. Komarov, 32, set a career-high in plus/minus rating (+18) and assists (20) during his sixth NHL season and first with the Islanders.

TOM KUHNHACKL: Tom Kuhnackl, a Landshut, Germany native, is one of eight active German-born players in the NHL today and one of two active German players to have won a Stanley Cup (P. Grubauer).

ANDERS LEE: Islanders captain Anders Lee led the team in goals for the third straight season in 2018-19, becoming the first Islander in 20 years to accomplish that feat (Ziggy Palffy 1995-1999). Lee, drafted by the Islanders in the Sixth Round of the 2009 Draft (151 overall), signed a seven-year contract on July 1 to remain with the team through 2025-26. Since entering the league in 2012-13, the Edina, MN native ranks ninth among all American-born players in goals (152) and sixth in power-play goals (48).

MATT MARTIN: Last season, Matt Martin returned to the Islanders, the team that drafted him in 2008, after a two-year stint with the Maple Leafs and led the club with 275 hits, good for fifth in the NHL.

BROCK NELSON: Forward, Brock Nelson signed a six-year deal with the Islanders on May 23 to stay with the team that drafted him through 2024-25. Since the start of the 2014-15 season, Nelson has only missed two regular season games and has the team's second longest Ironman streak at 177 straight games.

DEFENSE

JOHNNY BOYCHUK: Entering his 13th NHL season and sixth with the Islanders, Johnny Boychuk ranks 4th among all active NHL defensemen in career plus/minus at +134.

NOAH DOBSON: 19-year-old defenseman Noah Dobson is the only player on the Islanders 23-man roster who has yet to make his NHL debut. Dobson can join Mathew Barzal and Anthony Beauvillier as the only teenagers to play for the Islanders since 2010. Last season, the Summerside, PEI native won his second-straight Memorial Cup and was awarded the Guy Lafleur Trophy as QMJHL Playoffs MVP playing with the Rouyn-Noranda Huskies.

NICK LEDDY: Last season Nick Leddy was one of two defensemen to appear in all 82 games for the Islanders. Since joining the Islanders in 2014-15, Leddy leads all Islanders defensemen in GP (402), goals (40), assists (151) and points (191).

SCOTT MAYFIELD: Scott Mayfield, 26, posted career-highs in games played (79), goals (4) assists (15), points (19) and plus-minus (plus-18). The St. Louis, MO native led the team in PIM (68) last season and the team was 7-1-0 when he led the team in TOI.

ADAM PELECH: Last year Adam Pelech established new career highs in goals (5) and points (21), while tying career marks in assists (16) and games played (78). The Toronto, ON native co-led the Islanders with a plus-22 rating.

RYAN PULOCK: Ryan Pulock led Islanders defensemen in goals (9), assists (28) and points (37) last season, while being one of two defensemen to appear in all 82 games.

DEVON TOEWS: Devon Toews made his NHL debut on Dec. 23 and played every Islanders game from that point forward. From the night of his debut through the end of the season, Toews co-led all NHL rookie defensemen in goals (5), ranked 5th in assists (13) and 4th in points (18). The Abbotsford, BC native was the NHL's only rookie defenseman with an OT goal (Jan. 3 vs CHI)

THOMAS GREISS: Islanders goaltender Thomas Greiss won the 2019 William M. Jennings Trophy with Robin Lehner for fewest goals allowed in the regular season (196). The German-born netminder posted career-bests in GAA (2.28), SV% (.927) & shutouts (5) during his fourth season with the Islanders

SEMYON VARLAMOV: Semyon Varlamov is looking to make his Islanders debut. Last season, the Samara, Russia native recorded his 200th career win on Nov. 21 at LAK, becoming the fifth Russian-born goaltender in NHL history to reach that milestone.

Head Coach: Barry Trotz

Barry Trotz was named the Head Coach of the New York Islanders on June 21, 2018.

In his first year with the club, the Islanders earned 103-points, for their highest total since the 1983-84 season (104 points). The Islanders' fourth-place Eastern Conference ranking was their best finish since the conference was created (1993). The Islanders finished fifth overall in the NHL standings, marking their first top-5 finish since 1985-86 (5th overall).

Trotz moved into fourth place on the NHL's all-time wins list during his first season on Long Island, passing Islanders franchise legend Al Arbour on the list with his 783rd career victory. Trotz finished the 2018-19 season with 810 career wins.

Trotz spent the previous four seasons as the Head Coach of the Washington Capitals. During his tenure in Washington, Trotz led the Capitals to two consecutive Presidents' Trophies (2015-16 and 2016-17) and won the franchise's first Stanley Cup (2017-18). TONIGHT'S GAME

The Washington Capitals face the New York Islanders Friday night. The Capitals are 109-90-13-5 all-time against the Islanders and 5-3-0 over the last two seasons.

NOTE OF THE NIGHT

Sammy Debut - Capitals rookie goaltender Ilya Samsonov is expected to make his NHL debut tonight against the New York Islanders. Selected with the Capitals' 22nd overall pick in the 2015 NHL Draft, Samsonov will be one of 13 goaltenders selected by the Capitals to make his NHL debut with the franchise and the 13th to make his first appearance under the age of 23. Additionally, Samsonov, who is 22 and 223 days old, will be the 10th youngest Russian-born goaltender to make his debut in NHL history. Samsonov finished his first professional season last year in North America with a 20-14-2 record, a 2.70 goals against average and a .898 save percentage in 37 games with Hershey in the AHL. Samsonov tied for eighth in the AHL in shutouts (3) and won six consecutive games from Feb. 2 to Feb. 27, posting a 1.46 goals against average and a .947 save percentage in that span. Additionally, Samsonov appeared in five playoff games with Hershey, finishing with a 2-3-0 record, a 2.99 goals against average and a .897 save percentage.

TOP FIVE CAPS FACTS

Great 8 - Capitals captain Alex Ovechkin is beginning his 15th season with Washington this year. With a goal against the St. Louis Blues on Wednesday, Ovechkin has 11 goals in 15 career season-opening games, the most among active players in the NHL and three shy of the NHL record (Michel Goulet and Dino Ciccarelli). The franchise's all-time leader in games played (1,085) has 659 career goals, and Ovechkin currently sits in 13th place on the NHL's all-time list, 10 goals shy of passing Luc Robitaille (668) for 12th place all-time. Should Ovechkin record another 50 goals this season, which would mark his ninth 50-goal season in his career, Ovechkin will tie Mike Gartner (708) for the seventh most goals in NHL history and pass Robitaille (668), Teemu Selanne (684), Mario Lemieux (690), Steve Yzerman (692) and Mark Messier (694). Ovechkin became the 12th-fastest player in NHL history to reach the 650-goal mark last season and just the fourth player in NHL history to record at least 650 goals with the same team (Detroit's Gordie Howe and Yzerman, Lemieux). Ovechkin has won 17 individual awards in his 14 seasons: eight Maurice "Rocket" Richard Trophies (2007-08, 2008-09, 2012-13, 2013-14, 2014-15, 2015-16, 2017-18, 2018-19), three Hart Memorial Trophies (2007-08, 2008-09, 2012-13), three Ted Lindsay Awards (2007-08, 2008-09, 2009-10), an Art Ross Trophy (2007-08), a Conn Smythe Trophy (2017-18) and a Calder Memorial

Trophy (2005-06).

Young V - Jakub Vrana scored the game-winning overtime goal last night in the Capitals' 3-2 win over the St. Louis Blues. It marked Vrana's first career overtime goal, and he became the 58th player in franchise history to record an overtime goal. Last season, Vrana set career highs in goals (24), assists (23) and points (47) and ranked third on the team in goals. He became the 15th player in franchise history to record at least 24 goals in a single season before the age of 24 and the first since Nicklas Backstrom in 2009-10 (33 goals). Vrana ranked 10th in the NHL with 1.28 goals per 60 minutes of play at five-on-five (min. 1,000 minutes) in 2018-19, on pace with Chicago's Alex DeBrincat (1.29), Tampa's Steven Stamkos (1.23) and Edmonton's Leon Draisaitl (1.22).

Lar-Star - Lars Eller recorded two assists in the Capitals' 3-2 overtime win over the St. Louis Blues on Wednesday, his 20th career multi-assist game. Over the last four seasons, Nicklas Backstrom or Evgeny Kuznetsov have been out of the lineup for 13 total games. In those 13 games, Eller has 10 points (1g, 9a), including 8 points (1g, 7a) in nine games in this scenario over the last two seasons. Eller also logged at least 19 minutes of TOI 10 times last season. In those 10 games, Eller had eight points (3g, 5a).

Super Carly - John Carlson recorded two assists in Wednesday's 3-2 overtime win against the St. Louis Blues. That marked Carlson's 53rd career multi-assist game, which tied him with Larry Murphy for the third-most by a defenseman in franchise history. Carlson was named as the Capitals' alternate captain for the 2019-20 season. Last season, his 70 points (13g, 57a) ranked fourth in the NHL among defensemen, while his 57 assists were tied for second. With 405 career points, Carlson is the fifth defenseman in franchise history to reach the 400-point milestone, joining Calle Johansson (474), Scott Stevens (429), Kevin Hatcher (426) and Sergei Gonchar (416). With 689 career games, Carlson ranks third in franchise history in games played among defensemen and is one of eight defensemen to reach the 600-game mark.

Five Years of Excellence - The Capitals begin 2019-20 having won the Metropolitan Division in each of the last four seasons, while also recording 100 or more standings points in five consecutive campaigns. They are one of 10 teams in NHL history to hit the 100 point mark in at least five straight seasons, with the Anaheim Ducks (5; 2013-14—2017-18) the last team to do so. The only streaks longer than five seasons were achieved by the Red Wings (12; 1999-00—2011-12), Canadiens (8; 1974-75—1981-82) and Oilers (6; 1981-82—1986-87). The Capitals have recorded the most points (548) and the second most wins (253) in the NHL during that span. Additionally, the Capitals have won the most team awards during that span with four division titles, two Presidents' Trophies, one Prince of Whales Trophy and one Stanley Cup.

QUICK HITS

22 - The Capitals held St. Louis to 22 shots on Wednesday. Last season, the Capitals held their opponents to 22 shots or less just four times.

Dmitry ScOrlov - Dmitry Orlov's power play goal against the St. Louis Blues on Wednesday was just the second power play goal of his career. He's averaged just 0:48 per game on the power play in his career.

Holtbeast - With 258 career wins, Braden Holtby has just 12 fewer wins than the nine goaltenders selected ahead of him in the 2008 NHL Draft.

Sweet Nicky - Nicklas Backstrom has recorded at least 50 assists in six-straight seasons, one of two active players to accomplish the feat and one of 26 all-time.

ADDITIONAL CAPITALS NOTES

New Faces - Newly acquired defenseman Radko Gudas, and forwards Richard Panik, Garnet Hathaway and Brendan Leipsic all made their Capitals' debuts on Wednesday in St. Louis.

Gudas recorded 20 points (4g, 16a) in 77 games with the Philadelphia Flyers last season, his third career season with at least 20 points. Gudas' 51.14 goals for percentage at five-on-five ranked first among Flyers defensemen and second overall on the team (Claude Giroux: 53.13) among players with at least 30 games played.

Panik recorded 33 points (14g, 19a) in 75 games with the Arizona Coyotes last season, ranking sixth on the team in points. He ranked first on Arizona in shot attempt percentage (50.96 percent), on-ice shot attempts per 60 minutes played (60.84), on-ice goals for (44) and goals for per 60 minutes of play (2.71) at five-on-five among Coyotes with at least 50 games played.

Hathaway recorded 19 points (11g, 8a) in 76 games with the Calgary Flames last season, setting career highs in goals and points. He ranked third on Calgary in goals for percentage (62.79 percent) at five-on-five among forwards with at least 50 games played and ranked fourth among forwards in penalty kill time on ice per game (1:42), scoring two shorthanded goals.

Leipsic recorded 23 points (7g, 16a) in 62 games with the Los Angeles Kings and Vancouver Canucks last season, setting career highs in goals and points. Leipsic ranked fourth on Los Angeles in goals for percentage (51.28 percent) at five-on-five among forwards with at least 40 games played and

ranked second on Los Angeles in points per 60 minutes of play (1.73), leading the team in assists per 60 minutes of play (1.30) at five-on-five.

Teen D-Man - Martin Fehervary made his NHL debut on Wednesday, recording 13:35 TOI against St. Louis. Fehervary, who was selected with the Capitals' second round pick, 46th overall, in the 2018 NHL Draft, became the first player selected outside of the first round to make his NHL debut before the age of 20 since Samuel Girard (Nashville, selected in the second round, 47th overall, in the 2016 NHL Draft) on Oct. 10, 2017. Fehervary registered seven points (1g, 6a) for HV-71 in the Swedish Hockey League in 45 games during the 2018-2019 season. He also captained Team Slovakia during the World Junior Championship, recording five points (1g, 4a) in five games. Additionally, Fehervary represented Slovakia during the 2019 IIHF World Championship, recording an assist in seven games.
